


Course Questions - Scale Distribution Chart



Course Questions - Frequency Charts





Instructor Questions - Scale Distribution Chart






What were your reasons for enrolling in the course?



How many hours per week did you spend on coursework excluding time spent in class meetings?





If you are very interested in geography and politics, this course is for you, however you have to be prepared for a large amount of work throughout the two weeks
Be prepared to read a lot!
I would advise students to take the course only if they have an interest in politics and/or geography. Be prepared for upwards of 50 pages of reading per night, but know that it is enriching and rewarding when you learn good reading techniques.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Level: Challenging, but not too difficult when you put in the work and time. – Work required: There are 3–4 hours daily in addition to the class time needed to finish the homework which consisted of reading, writing, and doing research. – Prior training needed: The course "How does Geography Affect Politics" did not need much prior training, just the readiness to work and learn. – Ways to get most out of the course: Be patient and ready to learn from your mistakes!
Open up to new people and ideas, put effort into making new friends! Take advantage of the resources that are provided to you and reach out for help if you need it.
I would say that one should most importantly come to the course prepared to read a lot of information with little time but be able to dissect the most important details and formulate them into a theory.


What did Jessie Bullock do that was most helpful for your learning?

Share any information we couldn't verbally understand to the web page, as well as explain terms and ideas in understandable terminology.


What might Jessie Bullock have done differently to help you learn more?
